## I Am the Way, and the Truth, and the Life

Joh 14:6 Yeshua said, "I AM the Way — and the Truth and the Life; no one comes to the Father except through me. (John 14:1-6 CJB)

You can do a Google search and find many thoughts and points of view when it comes to truth. As an example-

In looking at truth you can try and look at it from a **Subjective point of view** – "Truth is relative to a person's beliefs about the world."

You can look at it from an **Objective point of view** – "Truth is based on facts that exist independently of a person's beliefs."

You can look at truth from a **Coherence point of view** – "Truth is logical consistency (coherence) among a set of beliefs an individual holds."

You can look at from a **Postmodernism point of view** — "In simple terms, postmodernists describe truth not as a relationship outside of the human mind that we can align belief to but as *a product of* belief. We never access reality because we can never get outside our own beliefs to do so. Our beliefs function as filters that keep reality (if such a thing exists) beyond us. Since we can never access reality, it does no good to describe knowledge or truth in terms of reality because there's nothing we can actually say about reality that's meaningful. Truth then is constructed by what we perceive and ultimately believe."

In that same Google search on truth from a biblical point of view, the AI search engine presented the below information.

According to scripture, truth is the self-expression of God, and the Bible is the touchstone for all truth claims:

- God's Word: The Bible is the written Word of God and is truth.
- God's nature: Truth is constant with God's mind, will, character, glory, and being.
- God's authority: God is the author, source, determiner, governor, arbiter, ultimate standard, and final judge of all truth.
- God's promise: Jesus promised his disciples that they would know the truth.
- God's worship: God will only accept worship of him "in spirit and truth".
- God's righteousness: Psalm 119:160 says, "the sum of Your word is truth, and every one of Your righteous judgments is everlasting".

The word "truth" comes from two Hebrew and Greek words:

• Hebrew

Emeth means "firmness, stability" and appears in the Old Testament 127 times.

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Aletheia means "essence revealed by appearance" and appears in the New Testament 110 times.
